Fine grading (+/ - sub levels) is used to measure progress more precisely and the predicted grades use the new 9 -1 GCSE grades. Teachers report on predicted grades, what they feel the student will receive in their final GCSE exams based on formative assessment, effort, attitude and progress.

Students who are due to sit GCSE exams in the summer term will have 2 sets of mock exams, which we call HCSEs, which are set in formal examination conditions. The first set in November and the second set in February. This will provide vital experience of revision and working in exam

therapy has had the required impact. DTT works alongside the PLC. PLCs are used and shared with students and they allow them to focus on areas that are a weakness during lessons, revision and home learning.

Individual subjects have their own policies and procedures that focus on marking and assessment. They incorporate the main formative and summative assessment points.

Heads of Department (HOD) are responsible for the accuracy and robustness of the data that is entered at each assessment point. The Raising Standard Lead (RSL) will guide conversations with each HOD and their Senior Leadership Team (SLT) line manager after each data point to discuss and devise a strategy plan. The RSL will also support HODs in discussing strategies and sourcing
